“ Hi Dianna, Jim, Jeanette, Kenny, & Linda and the rest of the family, I'm sure our Mom met you Dianna, but I never had the opportunity and haven't had any contact with Keith since we were kids and we moved away from Boone. I do remember happy hours playing with Keith & Jim & Linda in their old house near the railroad tracks...playing tag using iris leaves for whips. swinging on the huge long tree swing in the willow tree a block or so away, eating fish sticks with ketchup in the kitchen & Aunt Louise telling stories. I remember Judy had a whole tabletop of nail polish which I thought she had invented and therefore I was witnessing the national birthplace of rainbow fingernails and knew that it would make Judy rich and famous. Boone was a place like Garrison Keillor described where all the men were handsome, all the women were beautiful, and all of us children were above average. It was where the only way to cool off on hot summer nights was to hop in the car with all the windows down and Dad would drive us through the creek down behind Herman Park or over at Ledges State park and we would hang out the windows and get drenched with spray. Dad would make us lightning bug rings in the evenings and I still remember a picture of the 3 of us girls in the bathtub with water brown as mud from days spent barefoot outdoors from sunup till an hour past sundown. Dad told us a story a few years ago of how he worked at a hardware store and did deliveries and one day asked if he could take the truck home that night. He was excited to show off his driving skills so Uncle Guy jumped in the car with him and off they went. There was a slight downhill curve in the road heading into the railroad tracks not far from the house and Dad, not yet skilled at driving a stick shift, stalled just before the tracks. A train was coming. Dad couldn't work the clutch very well and they started to roll close to the tracks. Uncle Guy jumped out, ran around to the front, braced his feet against the railroad ties and used those huge long arms of his to keep the truck from rolling into the train. So if Uncle Guy hadn't saved the day, Keith & Jim & Linda & Judy would never have been born....
